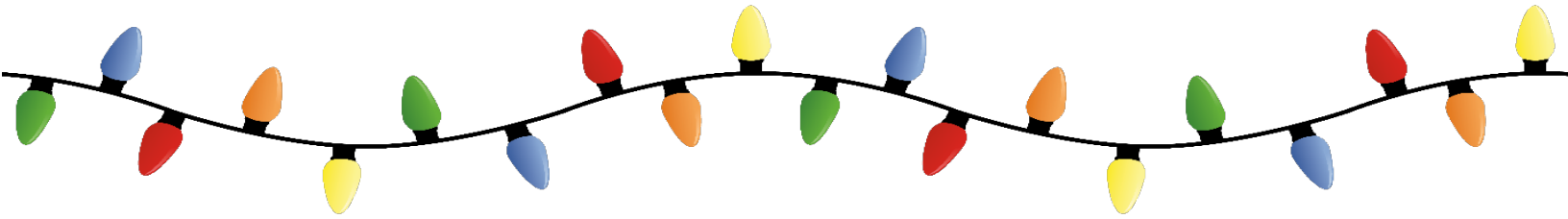

TYPES OF BOATS ACCEPTED

- Motorized boats: Single engine electric.
- No gas engines, jet skis, pool inflatables or paddle boards are permitted.
- Human Powered: human powered entries only (Kayak, Pedal Boat, Canoe)

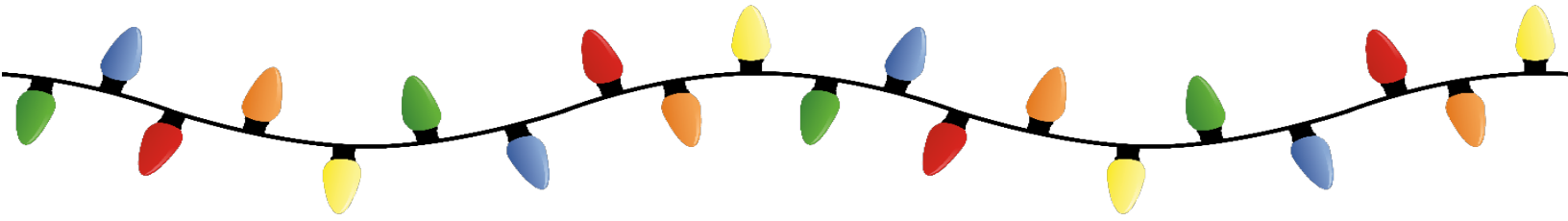
JUDGES AND AWARD CRITERIA

Judges will be chosen with a call for volunteers for each lake. Judging will take place on the weekend of the parade for that lake. All contestants will be provided a number that will be placed on their boat. All judging for the lake will end immediately after the boat parade is over. Winners will be made public on the following Monday.

All boats to be considered for judging will require an entry form in order to be assigned a number. Each participant will be provided a small sign displaying their entry number. Signs must be displayed prominently on the starboard side of the boat for the duration of the parade. It is strongly recommended you provide a light so the judges can read the sign number.

The panel of Island’s judges will use the following criteria to determine the winners: originality, technical design, and entertainment value. Evaluation is based upon imaginative use of lights, design, costuming, color, people/characters, movement, activity, and props. Please design for entertainment value, to maximize the parade theme.

Boats decorated that include commercial advertisement or a political themes/message will be excluded from judging. Commercial advertisement is not allowed on boats in The Islands and political signs are not allowed 15 days after the primary election.



Judges should have no personal connection to any of the contestants. Selection of winners must be based solely on merit so as to preserve the integrity of the event.

In the case of a tie, judges will review and discuss the merits of the tying entries and vote on the winner.

An award of Gold, Silver or Bronze will be given to the best boats. Criteria the judges will be looking for include:

- Is the execution creative and eye-catching? Is the overall presentation a real crowd-pleaser that appeals to all ages: theme, originality, effort, and appearance?
- Are costumes, animation, music, props, and acting employed to present the full scope of the theme? Is there color, movement, and sound?
- Is the music entertaining or involve the spectators? Is the overall sound able to be heard by judges and spectators on shore?
- Is the crew and passengers involved and enthusiastic in portraying the overall theme?
- Is the theme easy to identify? How well does the entry portray the theme selected? Is the theme visible/apparent to spectators on shore?

AWARDS

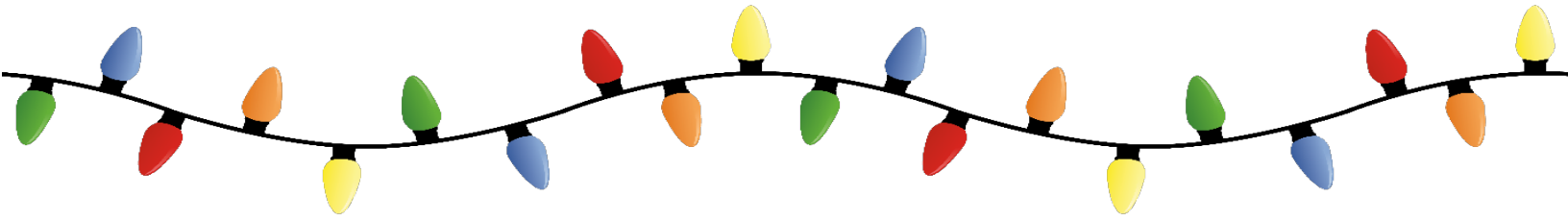
Category winners will be awarded a Gold, Silver or bronze Burgee (flag) for display on their boat throughout the year. All winners will be photographed for display at the community center and The Islands website.

PHOTOGRAPHY

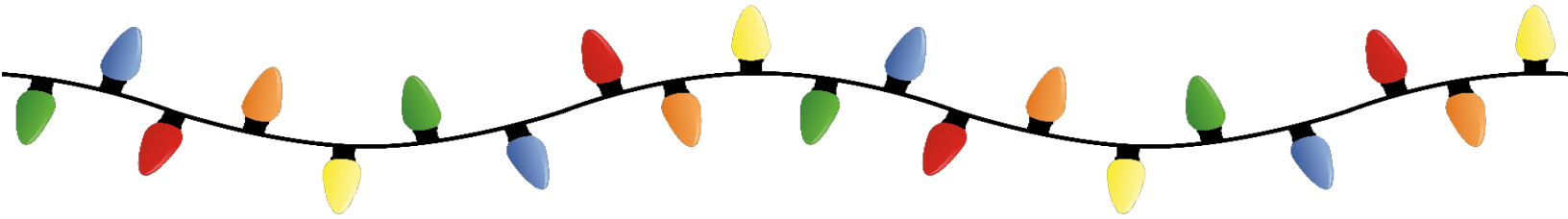
Boats may be photographed by the event for promotional purposes. These images are the property of the event and by participating in this event you automatically authorize the use of any of the images that include your boat, passengers, etc. The event will post any images online. Not all boats may be photographed.

THE ISLANDS BOATING RULES

- When boating on The Islands lakes, do so at your own risk. The association is not responsible for any damage including but not limited to damage to boats, docks, etc.
- Boating is restricted to owners, residents and their guests.



- All watercraft operated on any of The Islands' lakes must be registered with the Association, whether stored on or off the water. Registration stickers must be attached above the waterline on the side, front or back of the watercraft. Watercraft registration is non-transferable.
- Watercraft size shall not exceed twenty-one (21) feet in length and no more than nine (9) feet in width.
- It is recommended that watercraft owners and operators maintain public liability insurance covering water and boating hazards.
- Water vessels must use the supplied community dock ramps for entry to or exit from the lakes.
- Watercrafts shall be factory made by a reputable boat manufacturer and coast guard approved.
- No internal combustion engines designed to propel watercraft shall be permitted to be mounted on or carried on any watercraft while in any of The Islands' lakes (except for converted motors). Allowable propulsion systems for watercraft are limited to electric motors, sails, oars and paddles.
- Watercrafts shall not be tethered to the lake wall.
- Watercraft operated after dark shall show a white light visible from 360 degrees. Utmost caution is required to preserve safety and serenity. No loud music shall be permitted to be played or originate from any watercraft.
- Paddle boards (surf/boogie boards) are prohibited.
- Swimming pool type watercraft floats, inner tubes, wind sails and catamarans are prohibited.
- It is up to each individual Owner to ensure that his or her watercrafts is equipped with flotation sufficient to float craft and crew when awash.
- It is up to each individual Owner to ensure that safety approved preservers for each crew member and passenger are available on board all boats at all times, and that any and all other necessary safety precautions are implemented and observed. For health and safety reasons, individuals under eight (8) years of age and non-swimmers should wear life preservers while boating.
- Watercraft shall not be operated so near the shore of the lakes as to unnecessarily disturb the owners or residents or otherwise create a nuisance.



INDEMNIFICATION

Boat Entrant hereby agrees to indemnify and hold each other harmless, along with our respective officers, directors, agents, members, and employees, The Islands Management and HOA against any and all claims, demands, obligations, causes of action and lawsuits and all damages, liabilities, fines, judgments, costs (including settlement costs), and expenses associated therewith (including the payment of reasonable attorney fees and disbursements), arising out of: (1) the failure of Boat Entrant or Event, their employees or agents, to comply with the terms and conditions of these terms; (2) the negligent acts or omissions of Boat Entrant or Event and their employees, agents, or subcontractors; (3) the services performed or actions taken by Boat Entrant or Event and their employees or agents, including the operation and management of any event or activity incidental thereto. Each of our obligations to indemnify contained above will survive the expiration or termination of our sponsorship and the attached letter agreement. By submitting an application for this Event, Boat Entrant agrees to these terms. The Islands Management and HOA are not responsible for any personal property damage due to any cause, and by submitting the application each resident agrees to assume responsibility for any damage involving their entry.
